LEGACY AND CHANGE

📍 Yuhua SMC

As a subzone of Jurong, Yuhua's change over the years can be understood in the context of broader developments of Jurong. Some institutions in Yuhua continue as an enduring legacy of the communities that first settled in this area. Back in the 1930s, Joo Hwa Public School (today's Yuhua Primary School) was set up with the help of community members and businesses to provide education for the children of the farming community in Yuhua. Over the years, the Yuhua neighbourhood continued to morph, and became Singapore's first green neighbourhood in 2015, with the completion of HDB Greenpoint programme.

FROM PAST TO PRESENT

📍 Jurong GRC

What started out as a mangrove swamp was eventually filled with soil in 1962 to create the Jurong Industrial Estate project, the first industrial estate in Singapore. From the 1970s to 1990s, the Jurong Town Corporation constructed residential and recreational facilities to attract workers to the area. Today, Jurong has transformed into a lively neighbourhood with a substantial resident population. It is known for its natural outdoor green spaces and entertainment facilities that are frequented by everyone across Singapore.

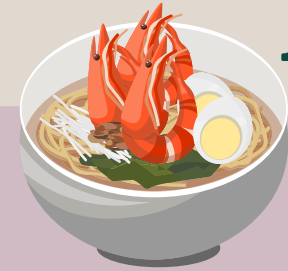


THE MYTHS IN A NAME

📍 Bukit Batok SMC

Described as a sleepy rural area, 'Bukit Batok' has a curious origin to its name. While there are varying accounts, what is certain is that *bukit* means 'hill' and *batok* means 'cough' in Malay. In one interpretation, the name *batok* came about because the cold air in the area caused coughs. In another account, *batok* is understood as the Javanese term for coconuts, which alluded to the coconuts trees that grew on the hills in this area.

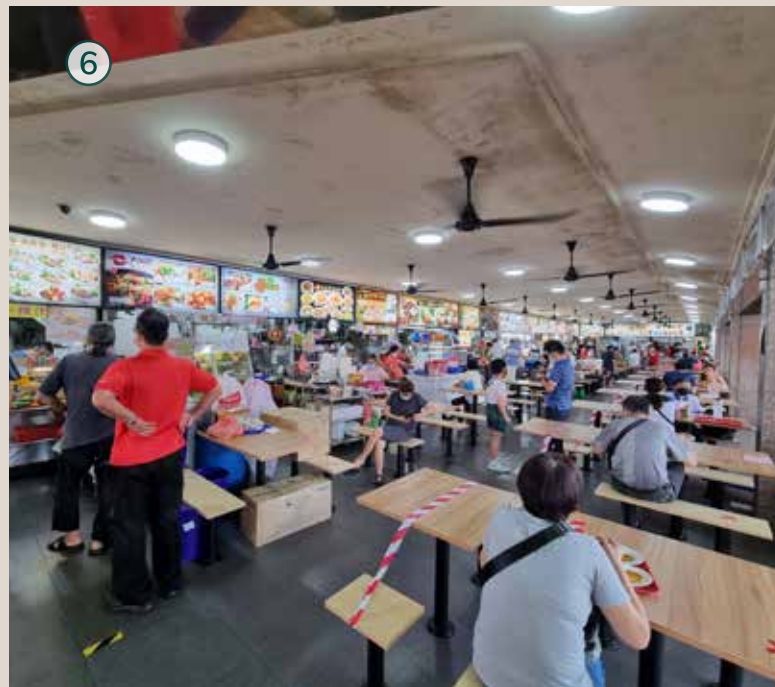

MASJID DARUSSALAM

3002 Commonwealth Avenue West

Identified by its unique flat cuboid-like structure in cream and brown, Masjid Darussalam was officially opened in 1988 and currently can accommodate up to 3,000 congregants.

SRI ARULMIGU MURUGAN TEMPLE

281 Jurong East Street 21

This Dravidian style temple was established in 1993 and consecrated in 2004. The temple is home to a six-foot statue dedicated to Lord Murugan and is the only Hindu temple in Singapore with a yagasalai, a permanent fixture for rituals that involves using fire.

JURONG CHRISTIAN CHURCH

2 Tah Ching Road

In 1966, before the church had a building, services were held in a humble shophouse along Tah Ching Road. They also served workers and residents who needed upskilling and technical education. From their humble beginnings, the church is now a hub that is home to six churches.

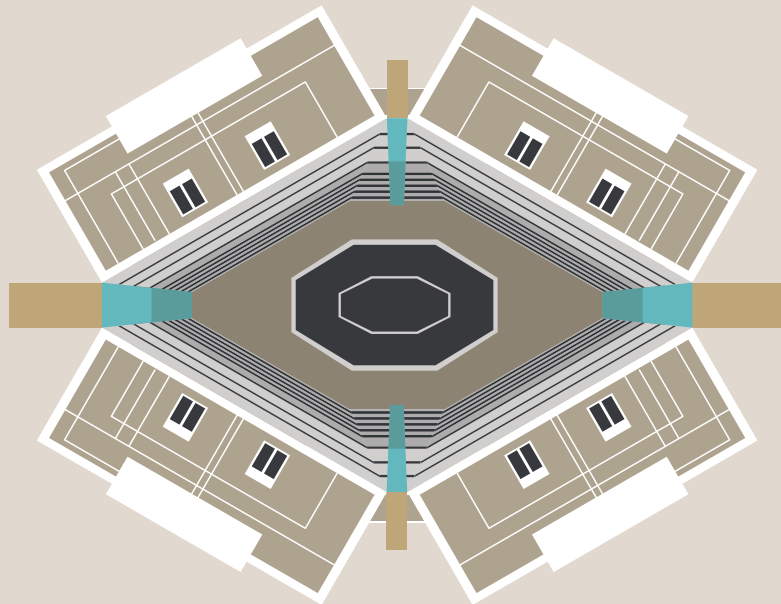

DIAMOND BLOCKS

📍 63 to 66 Yung Kuang Road

Affectionately known as the diamond blocks or “ji sap ek lau” (21-storey in Hokkien), these four rental blocks are touted as a rare gem in Taman Jurong. The diamond blocks are not only architecturally unique, but they also hold fond memories for those who grew up in the area.

SATTHA PUCHANIYARAM BUDDHIST TEMPLE

📍 395 Bukit Batok West Avenue 8

The temple was first located in Holland Road in 1963 and was subsequently moved to the current premise in 1984. Upon entering the temple, devotees are warmly greeted by a large golden structure of Buddha in the main temple hall.

CHURCH OF ST MARY OF THE ANGELS

📍 5 Bukit Batok East Avenue 2

Begun as a small hilltop chapel, today the church continues to serve the Catholic community living in Bukit Batok.

TONG WHYE TEMPLE

📍 212 Jurong East Street 32

Established in 1932 at Jurong Road’s 11th milestone, the temple was named after the hometown temple of Hokkien migrants in Quanzhou, China. It shifted to the present location in the late 1970s, which became the present location.

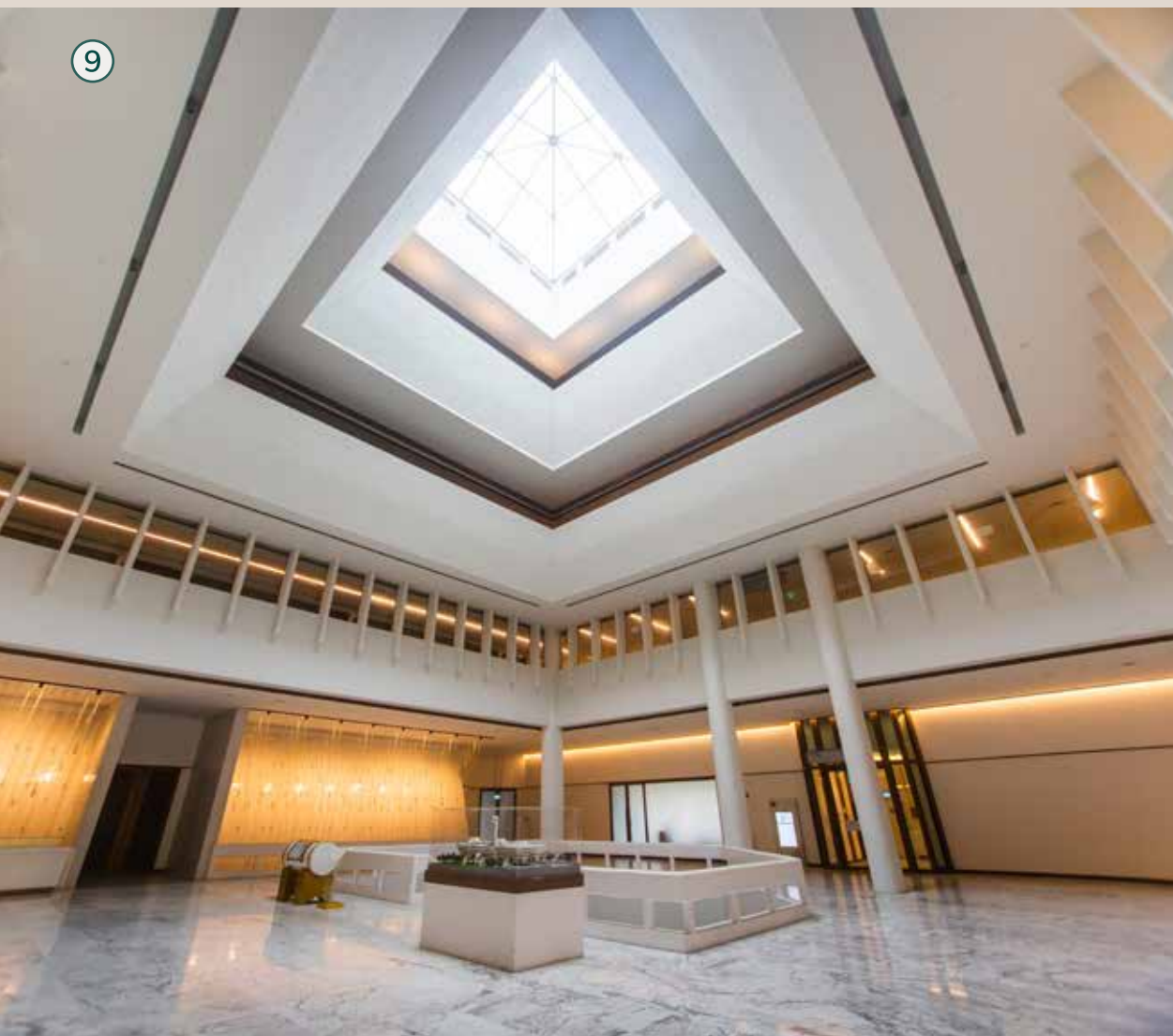

📍 Junction of 160 Jurong East Avenue 1 and Street 24

Located in Jurong East, this temple is an institutional member of the Blue Cross movement that collectively serves the community. It also offers free medical consultation for the elderly.

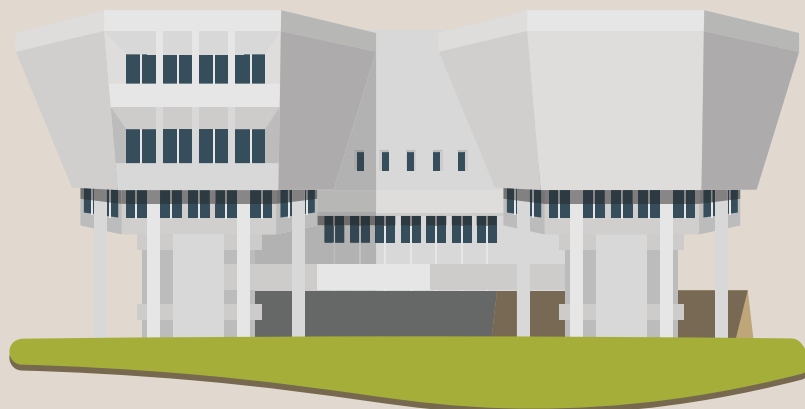

JURONG TOWN HALL

9 Jurong Town Hall Road

Jurong Town Hall plays a significant role in the country's economic development. The main prominent feature of the building is the 58-metre clock tower, the largest digital clock in the region. It was gazetted as a national monument in 2015.



JURONG HERITAGE TRAIL

Jurong is a treasure trove of heritage spaces waiting to be uncovered. Explore this exciting trail specially curated for you by the Taman Jurong Integration and Naturalisation Champions (INCs)!

1 AROUND JURONG RIVER

1 Chinese Garden Road

A prominent landmark for villagers in the past, the Jurong River has since been dammed to create Jurong Lake, Chinese Garden and Japanese Garden.

2 FORMER JURONG DRIVE-IN CINEMA

Yuan Ching Road

Opened in 1971, the former drive-in cinema was the first of its kind in Singapore. It used to be a popular venue among the families and couples until its closure in 1985.

3 "60 STALLS" AND "MARKET I"

3 Yung Sheng Road

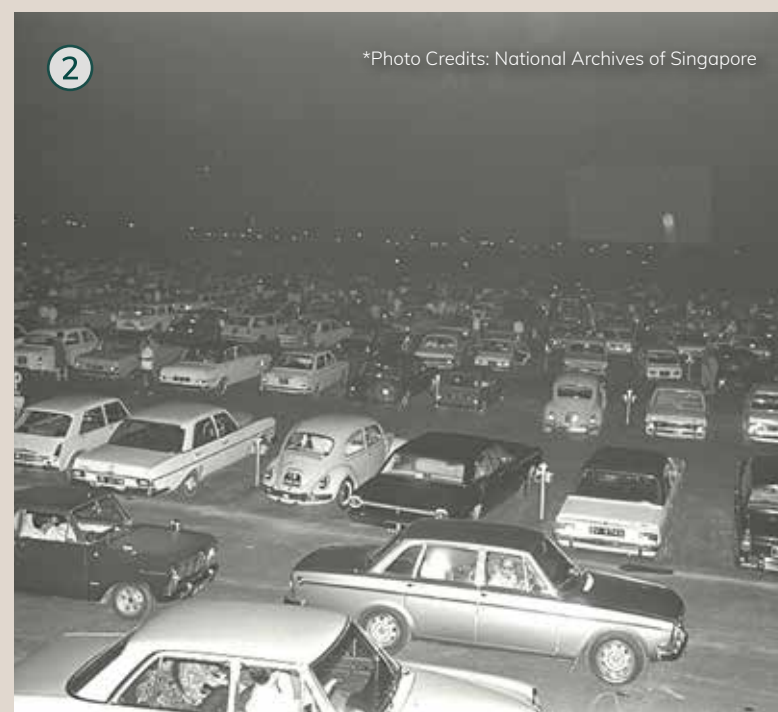
Yung Sheng Food Centre was one of the earliest to house itinerant hawkers in Singapore after the government started to resettle food hawkers from mobile pushcarts.

1 JURONG SPRING PLAYFIELDS @ JURONG NEIGHBOURHOOD PARK

📍 552 Jurong West Street 42

Consisting of three playgrounds, fitness corners, a basketball court and green spaces, Jurong Spring Playfields encourage both young and old to have fun in the sun!



2 JURONG EAST SPORTS CENTRE

📍 21 Jurong East Street 31

Wind down and relax by the pool at Jurong East Sports Centre. With a lazy “river”, wave pool and slides, the fun never stops here!



FOOTPATH COURTESY



Remember that we share a common footpath. If you are a cyclist, please give way to pedestrians and ring your bell politely in advance to alert them if needed.

3 CLEMENTI SPORTS CENTRE

📍 518 Clementi Avenue 3

Clementi Sports Centre boasts a variety of facilities and amenities—from amateur boxing to running and swimming—there is something for everyone to join in the fun!

4 BUKIT BATOK NEIGHBOURHOOD PARK

📍 Bukit Batok Street 21

With its tall tube slide, rope obstacle course, toddler play area and elevated boardwalk, families will have a whale of a time here! At night, the boardwalk is beautifully lit up making it the perfect spot for an after-dinner stroll.

5 SENSORY PARK AND PLAYGROUND

📍 305 Jurong East Street 32

This playground is an absolute treat with its net rope and coconut rope for children to move from tower to tower, coupled with a tall spiral slide. Younger children also have a dedicated playspace with rock climbing blocks, as well as tic-tac-toe and abacus panels!



A LEISURELY STROLL

Explore this area to discover some interesting outdoor places in our neighbourhood!



Look out for the Park Connector Network (PCN)!

This path continues into other neighbourhoods through an island-wide greenery network known as the Park Connector Network. Look out for the PCN signages and maps as you navigate your way along the roads, scenic rivers and canals that link you to the major parks. 2 SNOW CITY SINGAPORE

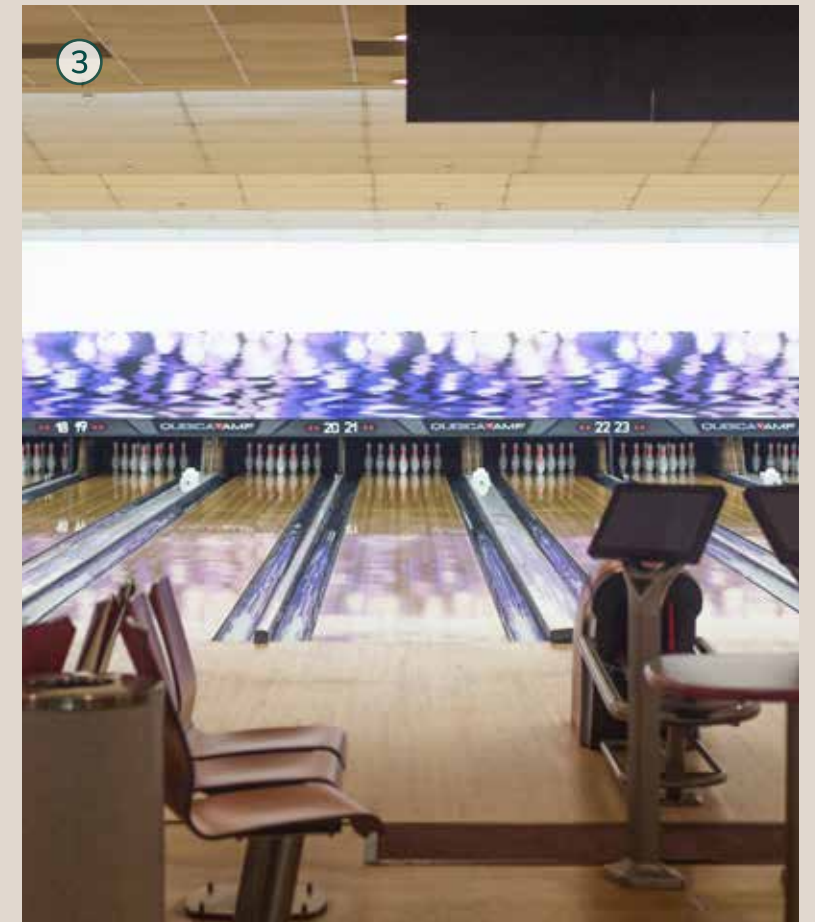
21 Jurong Town Hall Road
