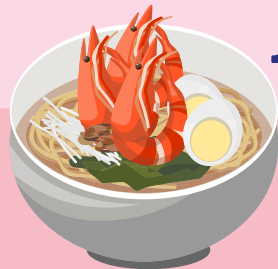
DEEP ROOTS OF HISTORY

Nee Soon GRC

Nee Soon was named after Mr Lim Nee Soon. He was an influential businessman, a rubber and pineapple planter, a rubber factory owner, and a respected community leader. When Mandarin became the official Chinese language, many Chinese dialect names in Singapore were translated to Pinyin. That was when "Nee Soon" was referred to as "Yishun". Chong Pang was derived from one of Mr Lim Nee Soon's sons, Mr Lim Chong Pang! Today, Chong Pang is known for its scrumptious selection of local food fare!

From savoury dishes to sweet snacks or desserts, a plethora of food options awaits the adventurous foodie. Explore a variety of local eats right in your neighbourhood today!

SHOPHOUSES ALONG SEMBAWANG ROAD
📍 Jalan Lengkok Sembawang

This stretch of eating places boasts a wide range of food, baked goods, & dessert choices. Everything from Chinese steamboat, Indian local delights, Korean barbeque, to traditional Chinese pastries is available! However, it is best known for Nasi Lemak with an extensive selection of dishes. It is a great supper spot that opens well past midnight.

CHONG PANG MARKET & FOOD CENTRE
📍 105 Yishun Ring Road

An old hawker centre well-loved by those living in the area, Chong Pang Market & Food Centre is an eating place filled with popular local eats such as boneless braised duck rice, prawn noodles, Chendol, and a newly minted MICHELIN Bib Gourmand (2021) hawker stall!

YISHUN TOWN CENTRE
📍 Yishun Central 1

Located near a major transport node and next to bustling malls, the town centre is a major community node for residents to get household necessities or have a meal at one of the many dining options available.

YISHUN PARK HAWKER CENTRE
📍 51 Yishun Avenue 11

Marketed as the "Home of the Hawker Heroes", Yishun Park Hawker Centre is a modern hawker centre with a mix of 43 traditional and new generation hawker stalls. A Hawkerpreneurs Incubation programme is even in place to encourage younger generation hawkers to set up stalls.

YISHUN N2 MALL
📍 414 to 419 Yishun Ring Road

Across from Yishun Park Hawker Centre, residents can find a cluster of coffee shops with a variety of affordable food. It is a humble but yet vibrant heartland dine-and-shop area that evokes a strong sense of nostalgia and warmth for many Singaporeans.

FOOD ALONG UPPER THOMSON ROAD
📍 Upper Thomson Road

Situated close to Springleaf Road, this area has a wide variety of food options. From a widely raved Prata spot to Chinese cuisines such as Ampang Yong Tau Foo and herbal duck rice, there is something for everyone here.

KEEP OUR TABLES CLEAN

In Singapore, it's mandatory for diners to return their trays and clear their tables at public dining places such as hawker centres. Let's keep our hawker centres clean again!



TRACING OUR ROOTS

Our neighbourhoods are rich with heritage and history. Take a walk down the streets and you will find historical places and conserved architecture, each with a story to tell.



LET'S BE CONSIDERATE

When visiting various heritage sites, refrain from making too much noise out of respect. Together, let's create a pleasant experience of our cultural heritage!

1 HERITAGE GARDEN @ YISHUN

926 Yishun Central 1

A joint project between Housing Development Board and National Heritage Board, this is Singapore's first outdoor heritage space. Find the bronze statue of the "Pineapple King" Lim Nee Soon, a rubber and pineapple planter and factory owner in the 1900s whom Yishun was named after. He was an influential businessman and an important pioneer of rubber planting in Yishun.

2 HOLY TREE SRI BALASUBRAMANIAM TEMPLE

10 Yishun Industrial Park A

The temple had its humble beginning as a makeshift altar constructed at the foot of a tree. It began from one man's dream of Lord Murugan and a majestic golden cobra. Word about the altar spread amongst the Hindu devotees at the Royal Navy Dockyard who worked and lived in the vicinity. Eventually, as its popularity grew, the temple was given a proper home at its present site.

3 YISHUN UNITED TEMPLE

17 Yishun Avenue 9

In 1986, Yishun United Temple was formed through the merger of three temples, Guan Loong Sheng Temple, Chern Nam Kong Siew Temple and Soon Say Keng Reservoir Tua Pek Kong Temple in response to the urban redevelopment plans in Singapore. These temples themselves were mergers of smaller temples.

MASJID DARUL MAKMUR

📍 950 Yishun Avenue 2

The mosque that stands today is a visual reminder of the muslim community spirit. In the early 1980s, the small batch of 102 pioneer residents of Yishun gathered Muslims from the nearby villages to form a Mosque Building Committee to lead fundraising efforts and proposed the name of the mosque. The mosque was officially launched on 25 July 1987.

CHURCH OF OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA

📍 10 Yishun Street 22

The church represents a part of Singapore's colonial history. It was set up to serve the growing number of Catholics in Sembawang, especially with the British's opening of Sembawang Naval Base. While services were initially held in a makeshift building, the church acquired a former school used during the Japanese Occupation, and eventually moved to Yishun in 1992.

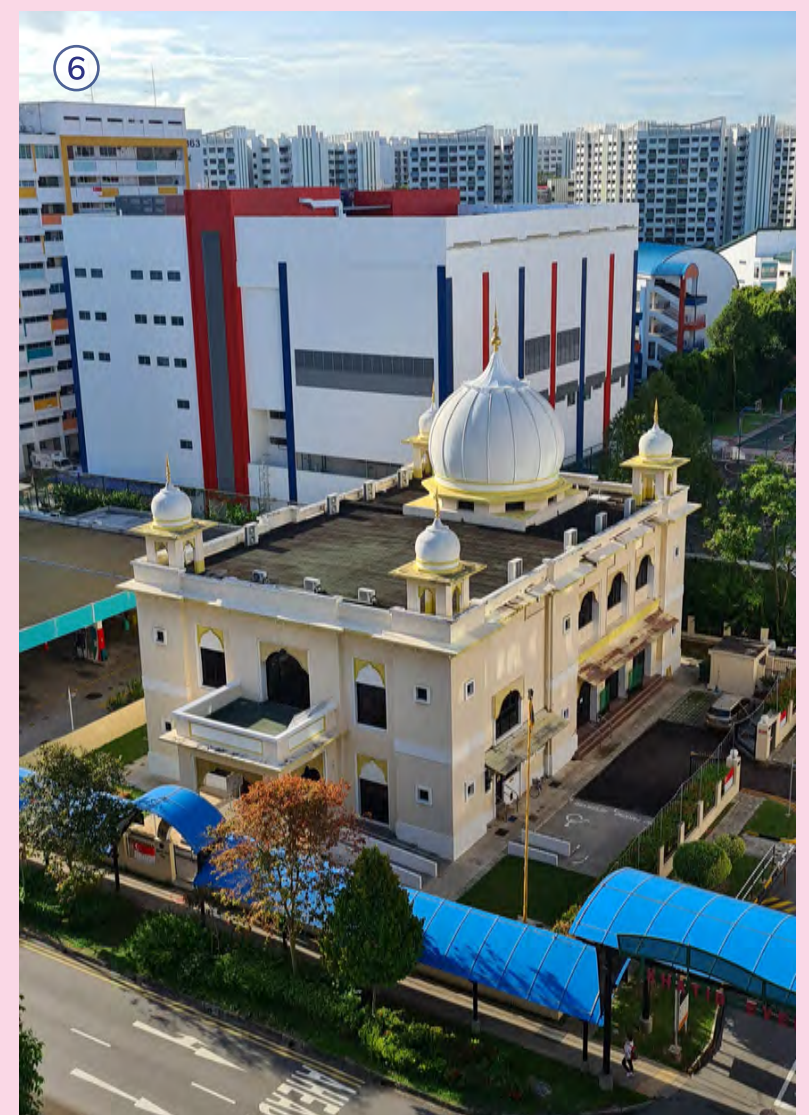

There are currently seven Gurdwaras in Singapore. The Gurdwara Sahib Yishun is said to have originated from serving the Sikh community working at the British Naval Base and the RAF Seletar Police Force Barracks.

Yishun Central

Inspired by the transformation lifecycle of the butterfly, the unique form of the three-storey structure lookout tower offers panoramic views and has quickly become an icon of Yishun.

Between Block 293 and Block 264 Yishun Street 22

Where Yishun New Town now flourishes, Chye Kay Village once stood. A place for the older generation to reminisce and for the younger generation to learn about their rich history, the heritage trail features photos and signs of past landmarks.

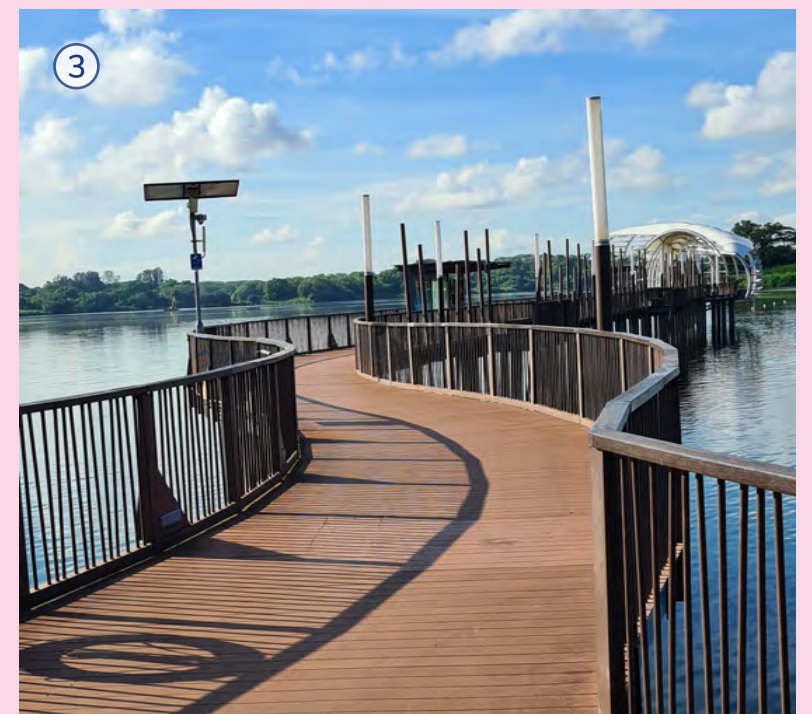
YISHUN DAM

1 SEMBAWANG HOT SPRING PARK

📍 Along Gambas Avenue

Discover Singapore's only hot spring park that is open to the public! The park features pools, a water collection point and information panels for visitors to discover more about the hot spring. The park's fruit trees, plants and flowers commonly found in the 1960s to 1990s, recall life in old kampongs and create a homely environment for everyone to enjoy!

2 NEE SOON CENTRAL COMMUNITY PARK

📍 Yishun Street 72

A 5-minute walk from Yishun MRT, this neighbourhood park caters to residents of all ages with playgrounds, a football field, badminton courts and a running track.

3 NEE SOON EAST SENIORS' HUB

📍 293 Yishun Street 22

The Nee Soon East Seniors' Hub is designed for seniors to hang out and have fun through a wide range of activities such as movie screenings, qigong classes, dance classes, health screenings, sports activities and more!

📍 329 Yishun Ring Road

Singapore's first interactive playground. Crooked houses, long slides, hammocks and interactive lighting pads immerse children in an imaginative play experience unlike any other HDB playgrounds.

SPRINGLEAF NATURE PARK

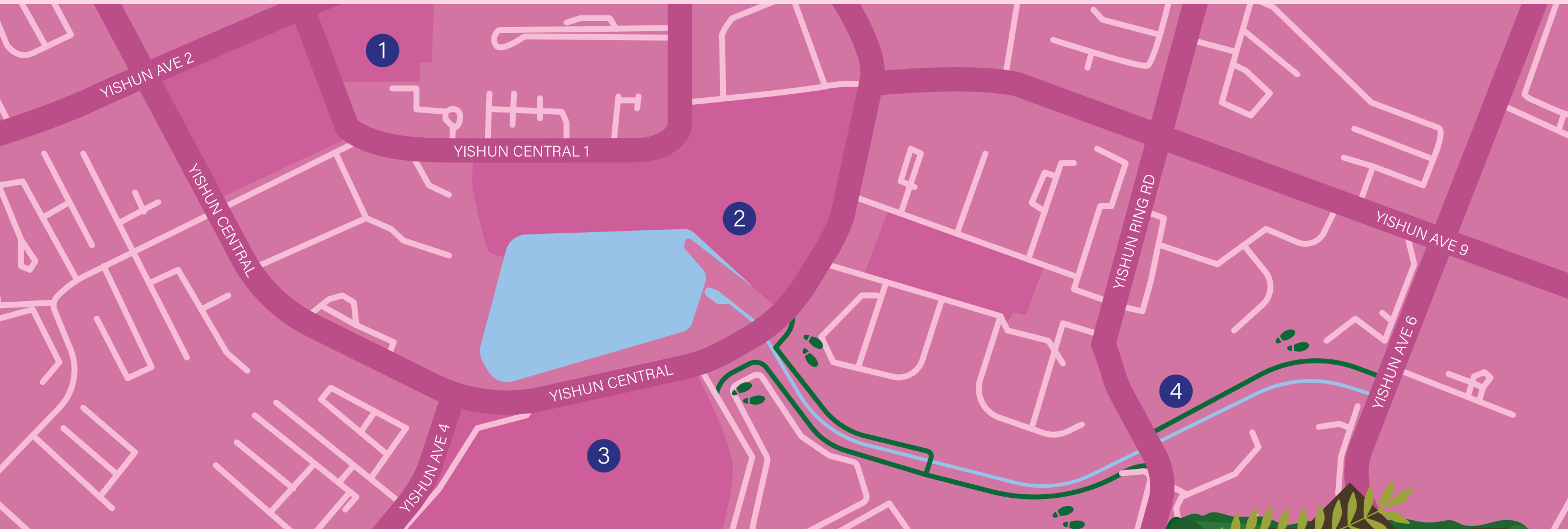
📍 Along Nee Soon Road and Upper Thomson Road

This park was formerly part of Chan Chu Kang village, named after the headman, Chan Ah Lak. In the early days, the forests nearby were treasure troves of botanical and zoological specimens. Today, it continues to offer a rich biodiversity.

A LEISURELY STROLL

Follow this route to discover some interesting outdoor places in our neighbourhood!



1 YISHUN TOWN GARDEN

This serene park nestled in the neighbourhood is great for an evening jaunt along the footpaths or for children to unwind at a playground!



2 YISHUN POND PARK

Yishun Pond Park is a haven of tranquillity for nearby residents. Featuring a pond surrounded by colourful plants and a variety of trees, shrubs and marshland plants as well as several bird species, the park is a great place for visitors to get close to nature.



3 YISHUN PARK

Learn more about Singapore's biodiversity and spot tropical fruit trees such as rambutan, durian and more. Previously an old rubber estate, it now houses many leisure facilities from playgrounds, to fitness corners to multipurpose courts.



4 YISHUN NATURE PARK @ YISHUN GREENWALK

This neighbourhood park considers nature and sustainability in its design, featuring 16 rain gardens and vegetated swale systems to allow natural filtration of rainwater.

Look out for the Park Connector Network (PCN)!

This path continues into other neighbourhoods through an island-wide greenery network known as the Park Connector Network. Look out for the PCN signages and maps as you navigate your way along the roads, scenic rivers and canals that link you to the major parks. Hop on a bicycle or simply jog along the park connectors!

KAYAK AND CLEAN AT SUNGEI KHATIB BONGSU

📍 Nee Soon East

The Kayak and Clean programme gathers residents every 2nd Saturday of the month to kayak to Khatib Bongsu to pick trash and clean up the area. By

involving residents in keeping their neighbourhood clean, the programme hopes to increase awareness on the issue of trash pollution and encourage an



environmentally responsible mindset. The programme also hopes to gather suggestions for improvements to the building of Khatib Bongsu Nature Park.
