
#### A NEW TOWN WITH CLOSE COMMUNITIES Marymount SMC

## TRACING OUR ROOTS

Our neighbourhoods are rich with heritage and history. Take a walk down the streets and you will find historical places and conserved architecture, each with a story to tell.



LET'S BE CONSIDERATE

> When visiting various heritage sites, refrain from making too much noise out of respect. Together, let's create a pleasant experience of our cultural heritage!

#### 1 THE DRAGON PLAYGROUND

**Q** 28 Lorong 6 Toa Payoh

This iconic dragon playground is one of the prominent features in Toa Payoh. Designed in 1979 by Housing and Development Board's (HDB) interior designer Khor Ean Ghee, visitors can admire the design of the playground consisting of terrazzo tiles and the body of colourfully-painted steel rings.

#### 2 KWONG WAI SIEW PECK SAN THENG 9 50 Bishan Lane

Built on the former ground of a Chinese cemetery, Kwong Wai Siew Peck Sang Theng is a cultural oganisation and columbarium located in Bishan. Visit the heritage gallery and learn the history of Kampong San Teng. Admission is free.



#### BUKIT BROWN CEMETERY Q 36C Lorong Halwa

Located in the central area of Singapore, Bukit Brown Cemetery was the first municipal cemetery to serve the needs of the Chinese community during colonial Singapore. It plays a significant role in Singapore's cultural history with many prominent Singaporeans buried in this cemetery.







#### BISHAN HERITAGE TRAIL

#### THE SALVATION ARMY TERRITORIAL HEADQUARTERS

**Q** 20 Bishan Street 22

Established in 1935, The Salvation Army in Singapore plays an important role in initiating regular programmes, including health checks and haircuts for the senior citizens in the community. Today, the current territorial headquarters serves Singapore, Malaysia and Myanmar and is a familiar fixture in Bishan.

#### HARMONY CENTRE @ AN-NAHDHAH 9 A Bishan Street 14

Being the first harmony centre to be built within a Mosque's compound, the two-storey centre showcases exhibits, artifacts and information about Islamic civilisation and lifestyle. There are trained guides stationed at the centre to provide visitors with first-hand accounts of the Islamic faith.

#### KONG MENG SAN PHOR KARK SEE MONASTERY Stight Hill Road

Founded in 1921, Kong Meng San Phor Kark See Monastery is one of the most significant and renowned monasteries in Southeast Asia. Today, the monastery sits on over 70,000 square metres which is equivalent to the size of almost 11 football fields!

#### TOA PAYOH HERITAGE TRAIL

#### LIAN SHAN SHUANG LIN MONASTERY Q 184 Jalan Toa Payoh

The Lian Shuang Lin Monastery, also known as, the 'Twin Grove of The Lotus Mountain' stands as Singapore's oldest Buddhist monastery. Admire the beautiful architecture which has the typical upturned 'swallow-tail' end sweep on either side of the roof ridges when you are there!

#### SRI VAIRAVIMADA KALIAMMAN TEMPLE

**Q** 2001 Lorong 8 Toa Payoh

The Sri Vairavimada Kaliamman Temple is one of the oldest Hindu temples in Singapore. The history of the temple began with a choultree (rest area) in the Orchard area in the 1860s. You can easily notice the ornate statue of the goddess Kali at the temple's tower entrance.

#### CHURCH OF THE RISEN CHRIST

**91** Toa Payoh Central

Opened in 1971, the Church of the Risen Christ drew Catholics from other parts of the area including Braddell, Balestier and Thomson Road. Like other religious instutions in Toa Payoh, the church has been an important pillar of support in the community with a number of social ventures.

#### **TOA PAYOH CREST PLAYGROUND Q** 131 Lorong 1 Toa Payoh

Nestled within the towering blocks of Lorong 1 Toa Payoh, this playground features raised mounds and stepping stones are recreated to resemble the 'big swamp'. Kids can have fun sliding down in those colourful tunnel slides!

#### 2 **TOA PAYOH** SENSORY PARK **Q** Lorong 5 Toa Payoh


Activate your five senses as you explore this sensory park located in the midst of a mature estate in Toa Payoh. It's a perfect day out for the very young and the very old!

#### (3) **ABC WATERS**<sup>@</sup> **KALLANG RIVER Q** 10 Bishan Street 13

Hop over to this peaceful river channel and explore a meandering stream, small islands with plants and natural materials such as rocks and civil engineering techniques that soften the edges of the waterway. The river channel was designed based on a flood plain concept.

#### **TOA PAYOH TOWN PARK Q** Lorong 6 Toa Payoh

Travel back in time as you take an enjoyable stroll around this tranquil park. Sit at one of the gazebos under the willow trees and admire the cascading waterfall, a series of delightful bridges, and not forgetting the iconic Observation Tower.

### **A DAY HIKE**

Explore the beauty of the nature corridor and discover the different native animal and plant species as you go on this hiking trail.




#### (1)**TREETOP WALK**

The TreeTop Walk offers a bird's eye view of the community of plants and animals that live in the forest canopy. Walk along the free-standing suspension bridge that connects the two highest points between Bukit Peirce and Bukit Kalang and snap some photos!



#### 2 **KHEAM HOCK PARK**

Surrounded by landed housing estates, Kheam Hock Park is a small community park with exercise facilities. The park also marks the start of the Lornie Nature Corridor.





#### 3 MACRITCHIE **RESERVOIR PARK**

MacRitchie Reservoir Park is a popular spot for sports enthusiasts and nature lovers. Go on on any six different nature trails and explore the biodiversity the reservoir has to offer!



#### (4) **ZIG ZAG BRIDGE**

This iconic zig-zag bridge and bandstand were given conservation status by the Urban Redevelopment Authority in December 2009. Walk along this bridge and you may spot a few aquatic turtles swimming in the water.

#### Set Out on an Adventure

This hiking trail consists of a park connector and the Central Catchment Reserve. Look out for signages and markers along the way as you navigate through the paths, forest and scenic reservoir views that link you to other parks. Take a walk or simply jog along the popular hiking trail!

#### 5G COMMUNITY GREEN HUB

**Q** Bishan East-Sin Ming

Nestled in a cosy corner of the Bishan East Zone 1 precinct is an urban sensation. As the first urban void deck garden in the heartlands in Bishan, its 30 green and sustainability stations form an engaging and educational DIY eco trail for all ages. Residents can look forward to learning all about the stories behind the kaleidoscope of avant-garde creations by the Zone 1 community.





#### KAKI CORNER'S HYDROPONICS Toa Payoh Central

The Toa Payoh Central Zone 6 Residents' Network launched a Kampong Kaki Corner at Block 158 Lorong 1 Toa Payoh, which includes a hydroponics corner amongst many other features. The hydroponics corner has given residents a platform to bond with one another while growing leafy vegetables to share with fellow neighbours, forging a strong 'kampong spirit' in the process.



**Q** Marymount

Launched in 2021, the Marymount Green Plan aims to create an eco-friendly community with clean and sustainable living. The introduction of these projects help raise public awareness about sustainability and food waste. These include developing community gardens, planting more trees, installing paper and e-waste recycling machines and conducting workshops on upcycling and waste reduction. Residents can roll up their sleeves to grow their own leafy vegetables at the community garden. Likewise, residents can look forward to participating in the muchanticipated initiative, One Earth, Save it@Marymount which comprises a series of activities that promote awareness about climate change and encourage the community to reuse, reduce and recycle.

#### MEET Mr Pandiyan S/O Vellasami The dedicated grassroots leader

A long-serving Grassroots Leader who began grassroots volunteering at the age of 18, Mr Pandiyan has contributed over 40 years of dedicated service to Grassroots Organisations and the community. His passion to serve and his selfless dedication has provided support and assistance to many fellow residents of Bishan East-Sin Ming and has helped bond the community over the years. Apart from that, Mr. Pandiyan has also been involved in other community organisations, such as the Tamils Representative Council (TRC).

During the Covid-19 pandemic, Mr Pandiyan started the TRC Covid-19 Assistance Programme where he helped raise more than \$30,000 in the form of vouchers, groceries, cash grants and books for families who need assistance. He also served in the Tamil Language Council, Tamil Language Learning and Promotion Committee, and the Tamil Language Resource Panel where he actively organised seminars, talk shows and national debate competitions to promote the use of Tamil Language among students and the community at large.





MEET Mr Muhammad Razali Bin Puasa The big-hearted volunteer

A passionate volunteer with a big heart and compassion to serve, Mr Razali is a familiar face to many residents of Toa Payoh East and its neighbourhoods, having served in the community for the past 7 years. As the Chairperson of the Malay Activity Executive Committee (MAEC) and Vice-Chairperson of the Toa Payoh Zone 4 Residents' Network, Mr Razali devotes much of his time and effort to serving various Grassroots Organisations and is well-known as a very creative volunteer who actively engages the community.

Mr Razali also spearheaded the "Public Space Wipe Down", a ground-up programme to thank frontline workers during the Covid-19 pandemic. He managed to rally around 90 locals and newcomers and their families over two weekends to wipe down public benches, playground and exercise corner. Additionally, the volunteers also cycled around the estate to spread the message about being socially responsible and to remind residents to take care of common public spaces.



#### MEET Mdm Tang Pui Wah THE SINGAPORE'S FIRST FEMALE OLYMPIAN

An inductee in the Singapore Women's Hall of Fame, Mdm Tang Pui Wah is a sporting legend and became Singapore's first female Olympian when she represented Singapore in the 1952 Olympics held in Helsinki, Finland. A bronze-medalist of the 1954 Asian Games, Mdm Tang is a familiar face to many around Toa Payoh, as she has resided in the town for more than half a century since the 1960s.



#### MEET Mr Lee Tang Teng The Trishaw Train Creator

Mr Lee is the creator of the 'Trishaw Train' or 'Bike Train' and resident of Bishan East Zone 4. His creation has been featured in the media and national car-free events. Mr Lee built the Trishaw Train over the years by repurposing unwanted bicycles donated by his neighbours. The Trishaw Train, which has grown to 7 cars long, has provided much joy and excitement to residents young and old during the quarterly family cycling event organised by Bishan East Zone 4 RC.



#### MEET Mr Keith Yeo The selfless volunteer

Having joined the Grassroots movement at 19 years old with the Marymount Youth Network, Mr Yeo is a familiar face to the residents as he actively engages the young and old in Marymount. He has participated in National Level PA Youth Movement activities during Chingay, hosted the Hong Kong Youth Delegation Team, and also represented Singapore's PA Youth Movement in an exchange programme to Shanghai. In 2021, he organised the Marymount Virtual Christmas Celebrations for the residents through a collaboration with The Salvation Army and other community partners. Currently serving in Marymount Grassroots Organisations, Mr Yeo is part of the working committee for the Bishan-Toa Payoh GRC and Marymount SMC CCC Bursary, providing assistance to lower-income residents.

#### MEET Mdm Mary Klass The determined olympian

Mdm Mary Beatrice Klass is a Singaporean sprinting legend who represented Singapore in the 1956 Olympic Games held in Melbourne, Australia. An inductee to the Singapore Women's Hall of Fame, Mdm Klass won a silver medal at the 1954 Asian Games. Mdm Klass has also witnessed the transformation of the Toa Payoh town from a squatter to a large developed township as she has lived in Toa Payoh since 1966.


